Sauman (Sue) Chu Associate Dean for Academic Affairs + a Graphic Design Professor at the College of Design

Chu's current research focuses on applying human-centered design in solving health related communication. Human-centered design is a creative approach to problem solving that starts and ends with users with the goal of building a deep empathy about the users one intends designing for. Her research challenges the norm by bringing users to the center of design decisions. Her papers were published in both design and medical journals. In addition, she actively engages students in service-learning activities. Over the past twenty years, her students completed more than 70 projects for over 50 different organizations through a service learning approach. Chu believes that service learning provides opportunity for students to engage in an important contribution to the community and learn about the social and cultural values of diverse communities. Chu is honored along the UMN Scholar's Walk with the 2018-2019 Morse-Alumni award as a Distinguished Teacher.
